A message from Mrs Tattersall....

I have been through all the payment items on ParentPay, and removed all the people who have paid in full for each of the payment items. If you can still see a payment item on your ParentPay, that is because you have not paid for that item (or have not paid in full), please contact me if you'd like more info.



Obviously, these are voluntary payments, and it may be that you couldn't afford, or didn't intend, to pay for a particular trip or activity, but equally, it may have been that you forgot or overlooked it. If this is the case, and you are willing to contribute towards your child's trip or activity we would be very grateful, as your contributions enable us to take the children on trips, and plan activities for them that are not covered in the budget, and we would not otherwise be able to provide.



















Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2

All Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) pupils are entitled to receive a free school meal. This is part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative and regardless of what benefits are being claimed.

Please do encourage your child/ren to try a school meal, especially those in Puffins class. We may not have our own kitchen but Mrs Nicholas still serves a hot meal/s every day from our servery....

However, some children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 may also have an entitlement to benefits-related Free School Meals. Children in this group are also eligible for Pupil Premium – additional funding paid to the school to support your child in their learning. It is important to apply for benefits-related Free School Meals if you think your child may be eligible. This is so that your child's school can receive this funding.

Your child will be eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals if you meet the eligibility criteria.

Children in Year 3 and above

Your child may be eligible for benefits-related free school meals if you, or the child themselves, meet the eligibility criteria. If eligible for Free School Meals, your child will also be eligible for pupil premium. This is additional funding paid to the school to support your child in their learning.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support (IS)
- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

Please see Mrs Tattersall, (who will be able to advise parents/carers further) if you think your child/ren meets any of the above criteria.






















Cross Country
