

✓ Why Regular Attendance Matters for Your Child ✓

Every day in primary school counts! Here's why:

- 置 Learning Gaps Missing lessons makes it harder to keep up.
- Social Skills School helps children build friendships and confidence.
- Broutine & Well-being Consistent attendance gives stability and reduces anxiety.
- Future Success Good habits now lead to better outcomes later.
- 器 Extra Support Schools offer resources your child can't access if they're absent.

Let's work together to give every child the best start!

Please see notice below that we are required to share with you each half term about unauthorised absences, including term time holidays:

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.



















Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

After School Club

Just a polite reminder that if your child is booked in but then won't be attending After School Club, to please let Little Lizards know as soon as possible - ideally on the morning that your child/ren were due to attend. June has to ensure that the correct staffing is put in place for the children on her register and on more than one occasion recently After School Club has been run with absent children!



With this in mind, sessions may still be charged if not enough notice has been given for children not attending. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Barefoot Sensory Path

Miss Turner (assisted by her daughter Charlie) has created a barefoot sensory path which is a very special pathway on our school field. This is designed with various natural and man-made textured materials (like large smooth pebbles, bark, rubber mats and pea gravel) that people walk on barefoot.

It provides a rich, stimulating experience for the feet and offers a variety of physical and mental health benefits, especially for children. Our children will benefit from the pathway in many ways including * Enhancing sensory development * Improving balance and motor skills *Strengthens foot muscles and posture *Connects to nature (Grounding) *Supporting emotional regulation and mental well-being *Stimulates conversation and in increases vocabulary around the five senses.





















Our Landewednack barefoot path is also accompanied by potted herbs, such as lavender, rosemary, thyme and mint, so the children can identify, smell and taste herbs as they walk. The pathway has proved to be a very popular addition to our breaktime activities.
