Dear all,

Over the course of this academic year, working closely with our catering provider Aspens, we have been looking to explore what improvements can be made to the catering services, while retaining the same quality of food offering. It is absolutely no reflection on the brilliant service we have received over the years, but more an acknowledgement that operational practices do need regular review to assure ourselves they are the best solution for our school now.

A daily delivered food service is something many of our schools have been using for a number of years with great success. Due to our proximity to a nearby production-level kitchen, Aspens who are specialists in catering, have advised us our school would be able to swiftly move to this model ready for the start of September.

Nationally you will be aware of the wider challenges linked to educational funding, and this solution will allow us to invest in different ways such as instead of replacing catering equipment coming to the end of its life (along with the heavy operational overheads on energy consumption kitchens require), into our classrooms and teaching spaces. We will continue to face inflationary pressures on food and production costs – this is unavoidable, and we can see that when we go shopping - but this solution will allow a meal cost to be £2.75 in AY 25/26 instead of higher values that would need to be considered otherwise.

Further updates will come from Aspens in the coming weeks, and I know this will cause concern having run an onsite production kitchen for many years. We are reassured by the existing service provided to fellow schools by Aspens, who are already operating a delivered service model, and are confident we will continue to provide good quality food to our children in the years ahead,
